2008 Sessions at West Kentucky and Lake Cumberland

- Lake Cumberland 4-H Camp* has 6 miles of shoreline and 1500 acres of rolling hills and forests. Cabins are heated with toilets and showers. The camp offers a low ropes challenge course, high element course, areas for riflery, archery, canoeing and fishing and for evening programs in the cozy campfire area.
- West Kentucky 4-H Camp* is in Dawson Springs and covers approximately 450 acres. The camp has a 14 acre lake for fishing, canoeing, hiking and wetlands studies. West Kentucky provides a state of the art challenge course program with seven high elements and twelve low elements. It also has facilities for archery, riflery, basketball, softball, soccer and football. Evening programs can be conducted in its rustic campfire area or singing area.

WHAT TO EXPECT AT HOME SCHOOL CAMP



Home School Camp is a family affair, offering opportunities for families to participate in learning about the environment together. The

success of the camping experience depends greatly upon parent support and involvement. At least one parent must accompany a family group. By being involved, parents can ensure that this is a family learning experience.

- Hands-on-learning is part of the 4-H motto.
- Family members support each other creating a sense of togetherness.
- Families benefit by sharing learning experiences and developing common interests.
- Parents can strengthen their social networks with other Home School parents and youth
- Learn about the many opportunities available to home school audiences through 4-H.

Activities and Study Areas:

The following activities may be offered, but will vary with location and availability of facilities:

- Day and Night hikes
- Bird watching at the bird blind
- Pond and water quality studies
- Tree recognition and Forestry
- Low Ropes (all camps)
- High Ropes (West Kentucky and Lake Cumberland only)
- Study of Kentucky wildlife
- Campfires
- Singing
- Canoeing
- Archery
- Riflery
- Social Dances

Accommodations are bunk beds. You provide your own linens, towels and bedding.

Cost— \$60 per person, includes all meals, overnight stays, and programs. At least one (1) parent must accompany each family group.
