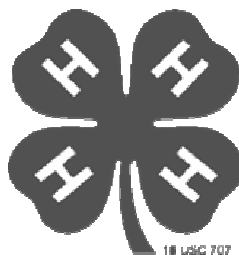

THE MISSION OF 4-H

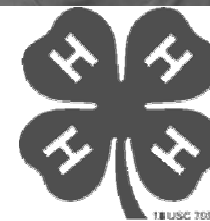

What is an Environmental Education Camp Experience?

- School away from school.
- Classes utilize the camp setting and teach pre-planned objectives.
- Topics can include:

 - * Wildflowers and plants,
 - * Wild Plants,
 - * Wetland study,
 - * Insects.
- A night away from home is a new experience for many children.
- The evening program is away from the TV— and could include live animals, a campfire, singing, dancing, a night walk, astronomy, or playing games.
- A planned experience that can provide many new opportunities to learn.

Where are the camps located ?

There are 4 camps in Kentucky. They are:

- North Central 4-H Camp is in Nicholas County near Carlisle, KY
- Feltner 4-H Camp is in Laurel County near London, KY
- Lake Cumberland 4-H Camp is in Russell County near Somerset, KY
- West Kentucky 4-H Camp is in Hopkins County near Dawson Springs, KY

All camps are operated and maintained by the University of Kentucky. These residential camps offer a perfect outdoor setting for overnight with indoor facilities for hands on Environmental Education experiences.
