

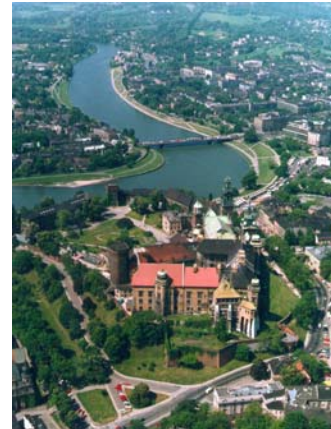
Animal Sciences Study Abroad in Poland

Collaboration between the University of Kentucky
and the Agricultural University in Krakow



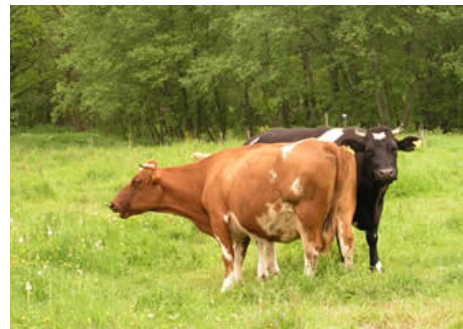
The trip will last 3 weeks and is designed to highlight animal agricultural practices in eastern Europe and the European Union and how they differ from practices in the



United States. Students will observe both traditional and modern production systems and how these comply with EU regulations on food safety and animal well-being. The program will consist primarily of visits to animal agricultural enterprises in the region including aquaculture



facilities, beef, dairy, sheep, swine and poultry operations, organic livestock production facilities and world famous national Arabian Stud farms.



Background

lectures on these operations will be presented by AUK faculty. On weekends, students will visit cultural and historic sites in Krakow and the surrounding region, including the salt mines in Wieliczka, the Auschwitz Holocaust Museum and the mountain resort town of Krynica.

When: May 17- June 6, 2009

Cost: \$3,950 (tentative) includes airfare, ground transportation in Poland, dormitory lodging, meals, travel insurance and UK tuition.

Participating students will register for ISP 599 (Summer Session 1, 2009) and also receive 3 credit hours of ASC 399.
